 - What are the two types of felonies? Give an example of each
 - What are some common punishments for crimes?
 - How can prisoners be released? Who makes this decision? What is a criticism of parole?

 - What protection is guaranteed by the 6th Amendment? Why is *Gideon v. Wainwright* important?
 - What protection is guaranteed by the 8th Amendment? What is bail?

 - Create a flow chart describing the 6 steps in criminal trials
 - Be sure to accurately describe:
 - Arrest
 - Preliminary Hearing

 - Arraignment (what is plea bargaining?)
 - Trial (what is the purpose of cross-examination?)
 - What are the three possible outcomes of a trial?
